Greetings to all. As we welcome a new church year with the Advent season, your church council is wrapping up another year that will conclude with the Annual Meeting to be held on January 22, 2023.

Efforts continue to bring our transition to the city water system. James Smock worked patiently with an engineer, the city, and others to navigate the steps needed to reach a point that we could formally apply for a connection. Joann Hoffmeyer completed the necessary application. The Council decided that at this point, a Water Committee would be formed to complete the necessary tasks to reach the final goal of a city water connection to the church. Joann will chair the committee.

A second continuing concern for the council has been the care and repair for our church and property. Chad Lelm has been instrumental in identifying and helping to solve the variety of issues that are part of property care. If anyone notices a need for attention to something dealing with facilities, please speak to Chad so we may coordinate any efforts to remedy problems.

Many individuals deserved thanks for their service in ways great and small during this past year. One way to recognize those participants is through the Annual Report that will be prepared for our Annual Meeting. Please, those of you who are involved with committees and various groups within the church, thoughtfully prepare a report by the end of December and turn it in to the Church Secretary to be included.

Have yourself a Holy little Christmas

The "Christmas season" seems to begin earlier every year. Some stores had Christmas stuff on the shelves weeks before Halloween. What madness! We go dashing through the stores to the beat of *Jingle Bells*; and we go "Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree" until we crash from exhaustion.

Revelry and gift-giving are fine and fun, but if we're not careful they can snowball out of control. Stewarding a Holy and meaningful Christmas means balancing the commercial with the spiritual. Here are some tips:

Observe Advent: The four weeks *before* Christmas Day comprise the Advent Season, a time to *prepare* for Christmas through prayer, song, worship, and spiritual disciplines. Lean into the spirit of Advent. Advent devotionals can help (I recommend Richard Rohr's *Preparing for Christmas*).

Observe the Christmas *season*: The church calendar lists the *season* of Christmas from Dec. 24 to the feast of Epiphany on Jan. 6. Until the 20th century, these 12 Days of Christmas were the time for celebration and partying. Make them special in your life and family.

Cut the consumerism: Limit your shopping and spending by setting a strict budget or gifting the

people in your life with homemade presents, favors, or ways to spend time together.

Party hardly: For some, Christmas is an excuse to overeat and drink to excess. Moderate your consumption.

Most importantly, pray:

Ask God to help you and

your family craft a meaningful and joyful Advent and Christmas. Ask God to send you wisdom, resources, and people who can journey through the spiritual season with you.

By carefully stewarding your faith life, Advent and Christmas can be a time for real spiritual growth.

A heartfelt 'Thank You' to all of you for your faithful service in Christ, for being Christ's hands and shining His bright light amongst your brothers and sisters.


