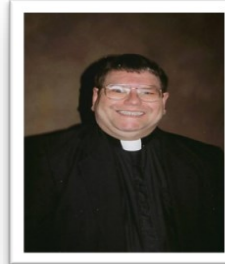

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR TIM

"A Month of Thanksgiving"

The entire month of November is a time devoted for gratitude.

The first Sunday of November is always All Saints Sunday when we give God thanks for all of the Christian witnesses who have passed on to eternal glory before us. We had only one member who died this year: Marie Anderson. But this is also a time to remember with love those who inspired our own faiths in our lives and the saints who have died preserving the church on earth.

Tuesday, November 5th is Election Day. Community Lutheran Church is serving as a voting site for Bullhead City this year. I encourage all of you to vote and contribute to the democracy that God has blessed our nation with.

Saturday, November 9th, is when we will have a Celebration of Life for Marie Anderson at 1 pm. Marie has been a member of our congregation for only five years, but she often was the first to welcome new people to our congregation, she was active in community organizations and talked about the church with her friends, and she insisted that we have more potlucks and groups going out to breakfast after church. We give thanks to God for her life, love, and joy in being a member of the church.

Veterans Day is on November 11th. And on Sunday, Nov. 10th, we will honor the veterans of our congregation and give thanks to God for their patriotism, service, and bravery for our country.

The last Sunday in November is Christ the King Sunday when we remember once more the salvation God has brought us through the death of Jesus Christ. Since that Sunday, November 24th, is right before Thanksgiving Day, we will have a "Thanksgiving Feast" potluck during our fellowship time following our 10 am service on that Sunday. Again we can demonstrate our thanks for the many blessings that God bestows

upon us together.

Also during the month of November, we give thanks for the return of our winter residents and we have started having two services every Sunday at 9 am and 11 am AZ Time. The exception to this rule is the last Sunday of the month when the entire congregation comes together for one service at 10 am AZ Time and for a special themed fellowship time afterwards. And this will continue throughout the winter months.

So let us all live in the spirit of thanksgiving like the apostle Paul encouraged us to do in Colossians: "May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from [Christ's] glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light." (Colossians 1:11-12)

3 OTHER GIFTS: Pack full with other fun toys, personal care items, and school supplies.

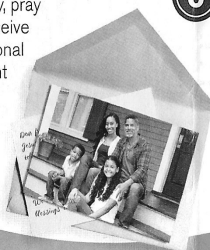
4 PRAY: Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your gift. Include a personal note and photo to delight the heart of a child.

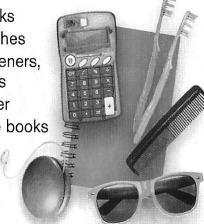

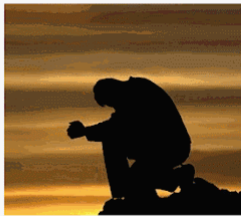

Let us remember the ones God called home out of our midst, and keep their families and friends in our prayers.

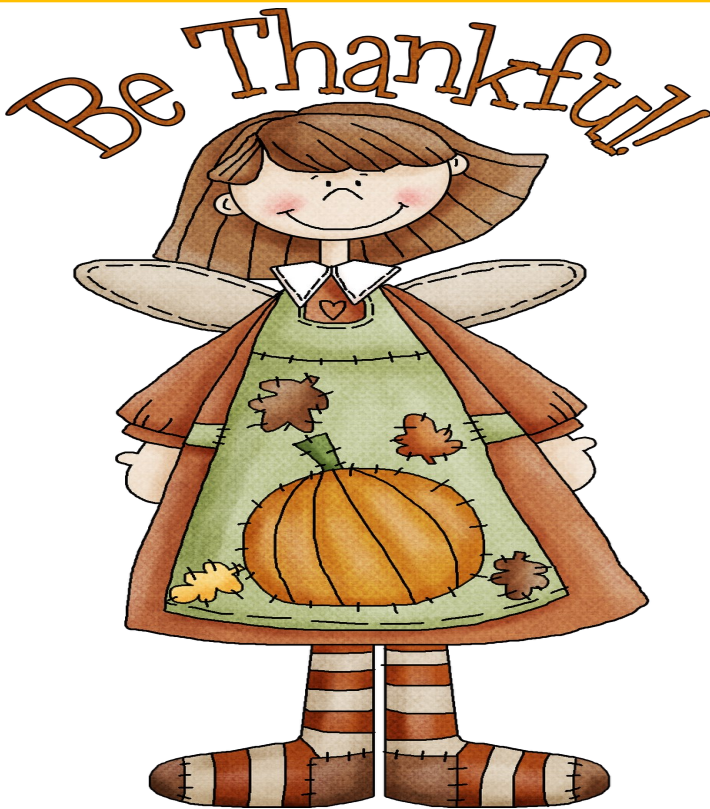
